Re: 2021 Permit Fee Schedule

The proposed Village of Jackson, Building Inspection Department 2021 Permit Fee Schedule is attached for your review. Beyond some general formatting changes, there were minor fee adjustments made to better reflect the time and cost involved. The Village last approved a general fee increase in 2012.

Notable changes to the Fee Schedule are listed below:

1. Permit and Plan Review fees for sheds was added to 17-F.
2. Roofing and Siding Permit were added as separate line items under 17-D & 17-E. A flat fee for each was established rather than the prior \$13.00 / \$1,000 of value.
3. The Plan Review fee for 1 & 2 Family residential additions was increased from \$35.00 to \$75.00.
4. The Plan Review fee for accessory structures was increased from \$35.00 to \$40.00.
5. Occupancy Permit fees for 1 & 2 Family and Multi-Family Units was increased from \$55.00 to \$60.00.
6. Occupancy Permit fees for all 1 & 2 Family additions was increased from \$55.00 to \$60.00.
7. Occupancy Permit fees for all Commercial/Industrial additions was increased from \$85.00 to \$100.00
8. The wording "Property Maintenance Fee" was removed as this was a fee collected for pre-sale inspections of structures which is no longer permitted under State Law. The change establishes a simple "Special Inspection Fee" instead.
9. The minimum permit fee for Items 17-F through 17-I were changed to reflect \$5.00 increased in both the permit fee and the plan review fees associated with each item.
10. The penalty for failure to obtain a permit was increased from double fees to triple fees.
