1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Joseph Simon called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m.

Members Present: Michelle Klemp, Joseph Simon, Michelle Zak.

Staff Present: Police Chief Ryan Vossekuil, Village Attorney Matt Parmentier and Clerk Jilline Dobratz.

2. Approval of Minutes for the Sex Offender Residence Board Meeting of April 19, 2021

Motion by Michelle Zak, second by Michelle Klemp to approve the minutes for the Sex Offender Residence Board meeting of April 19, 2021.

Vote: 3 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

3. Overview of petition process and meeting procedures by Village Attorney

Attorney Parmentier gave background information on the procedures and the Village's Sex Offender Residence Ordinance.

4. Public Presentation of Petition for Residency at N161W19504 Forestview Drive by petitioner or petitioner's representatives

Vincent Jablonski appeared via telephone and gave background information on his petition. He is requesting to go back to his residence. He has been working and taking classes while incarcerated. He would also like to perform community service and is currently seeking employment. The home he is petitioning to return to was purchased in 2004 and it was stated he believes he has a support system at home.

Mr. Jablonski's Social Worker, Ms. Fischer, appeared via telephone and provided information on his conduct, education and employment searches while being incarcerated.

Monica Daniels, Probation and Parole Agent, explained Tuesday is his release date in which Mr. Jablonski has to be released to the community. He would either be released to his home or be homeless. Agent Daniels explained his conviction, GPS monitoring for life, no internet access, required therapy and group treatment. Total supervision is four years unless there are new charges.

5. The Residence Board intends to convene into closed session pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 18.85(1)(f) for the purpose of considering financial, medical, social, or personal histories or disciplinary data of specific persons, preliminary consideration of specific personnel problems, or the investigation of charges against specific persons which, if discussed in public, would be likely to have a substantial adverse effect upon the reputation of any person referred to in such histories or data, or

involved in such problems or investigations; and pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 19.85(1)(g) for the purpose of conferring with legal counsel for the Board who is rendering oral or written advice concerning strategy to be adopted by the Board with respect to litigation in which the Board is or is likely to become involved. The purpose of the closed session will be to discuss aspects of the Petition that qualify for closed session discussion under the above-stated exemptions.

Motion by Joseph Simon, second by Michelle Zak to convene into closed session at 6:42 p.m.

Roll Call Vote: 3 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

Reconvene into Open Session

Motion by Michelle Klemp, second by Joseph Simon to reconvene into Open Session at 7:00 p.m.

Vote: 3 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.

The Residency Exemption Worksheet was completed by the Residence Board members.

6. Discussion, Deliberation and Action on Petition

Motion by Joseph Simon, second by Michelle Zak to approve an exemption to the Petitioner, Vincent Jablonski, subject to the following conditions:

1. Mr. Jablonski participates in and completes Department of Corrections approved group treatment.
2. Mr. Jablonski is monitored by GPS for life. The GPS monitoring shall establish "exclusion zones" around all properties identified in Section 20-36 of the Village of Jackson's Sex Offender Residency Ordinance, as amended from time-to-time, and where his presence is otherwise prohibited by applicable law, ordinance, regulation, or judgement.
3. Mr. Jablonski participates in all required meetings with his parole officer for his full period of active supervision, which at the time of this Exemption is anticipated to be four years.
4. Mr. Jablonski participates in all required home visits with his parole officer for his full period of active supervision, which at the time of this Exemption is anticipated to be four years.
5. Mr. Jablonski does not access the internet in any manner that violates his Judgement of Conviction. Any permitted internet access may occur only with the Department of Corrections approval.
6. Mr. Jablonski must notify the Village of Jackson Police Department any time he is granted access or use of a device with internet access by the Department of Corrections.
7. Mr. Jablonski must be accompanied by a sober chaperone anytime he leaves the Property for any non-DOC-exempt activity.
8. Mr. Jablonski comply with all curfew and time-away-from-Property restrictions established by the Department of Corrections unless granted an exemption by the Department.

9. Mr. Jablonski does not participate in any public Halloween activities, including decorating the Property, handing out candy, or having outside lights on during trick-or-treating.
10. Mr. Jablonski complies with all other applicable laws, regulations, and conditions of his release.

Vote: 3 ayes, 0 nays. Motion carried.
